



PATHWAYS2RESILIENCE

FIRST CALL FOR APPLICANTS

The EU-funded project Pathways2Resilience is a key contributor to the implementation of the EU Mission on Adaptation to Climate Change. The Pathways2Resilience programme will allocate €21 million in sub-grants via two open calls to support at least 100 European regions and communities to co-design locally-led resilience pathways.

- In the first Pathways2Resilience call for applicants, 40 regions and communities will be selected to receive a sub-grant of up to €210 000 for a project period of 18 months to support activities related to the development of the resilience pathways.
- The sub-grants will support activities related to the development of the adaptation pathways.

WHAT DOES THE PATHWAYS2RESILIENCE PROGRAMME OFFER?

The Pathways2Resilience programme's transformational adaptation framework – the Regional Resilience Journey, will guide regions and communities through different steps to accelerate their path towards climate resilience, resulting in the creation of:

Additionally, the programme will offer the following services and capacity-building activities:

- Interactive workshops and seminars, to present the various steps and phases of the Regional Resilience Journey and to build capacities around the conditions that enable a resilient transformation.
- Innovation Practice Groups, to enable the sharing of best practices and knowledge between a range of different stakeholders.
- A peer-led mentoring programme, allowing regions and communities to mentor each other and create cross-regional relationships.
- One-to-one support provided by the Pathways2Resilience consortium to at least 9 regions/communities throughout the project.

ELIGIBILITY

The call for applicants is open to:

- Eligible European regions and communities, within Europe's biogeographical regions, located in EU Member States and Horizon Europe Associated Countries.
- Local and regional public authorities as well as bodies governed by public law, either as single beneficiaries or as coordinators of consortia.
- Applicants do not explicitly need to be signatories to the Charter of the Mission on Adaptation to Climate Change to apply to the call.
